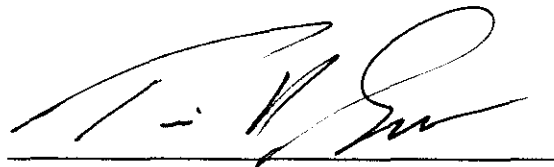


CANVASS OF THE AMENDMENT ELECTION
