Grayson County Commissioners Court approve Ballot On Demand hand marked paper ballots for In-Person Voting.

On Tuesday, August 12, the Grayson County Commissioners Court unanimously approved the purchase <a href="https://agendasuite.org/iip/grayson/meeting/Details/271">https://agendasuite.org/iip/grayson/meeting/Details/271</a>, of equipment necessary to implement the Executive Order #14248, Ballot on Demand paper ballots for in-person voting, beginning with the November 2025 election.

This change reflects the Court's ongoing commitment to transparency, security, and voter confidence in the election process. The Commissioners approved approximately \$403,540.00 in funding for equipment, including voting pollbooks, printers, and other essential materials to support the transition.

To clarify, Grayson County is not switching to hand-counting ballots. Every in-person vote will still be scanned and counted using the same DS200 ballot scanners at each polling location — just as before.

What's new is how eligible voters will fill out their ballots. Instead of using a machine to mark their choices, voters will now mark their ballots by hand. Once completed, each ballot will be scanned and counted using the same tabulating process as before, ensuring the same level of accuracy.

The county will maintain accessible ballot-marking devices for voters with disabilities, ensuring that all voters can cast a ballot privately and independently, as required by law.

The Grayson County Elections Department and its staff are fully committed to the successful implementation of the in-person ballot-on-demand (BOD) method of voting that was approved during Commissioners Court on Tuesday, August 12.


We look forward to educating the voters of Grayson County on the details of this process so they can show up and vote with confidence during the November 2025 election.
